Bishop Herbert House is a purpose-built care home, situated in the historic city of Norwich, within close proximity to a range of shops, local amenities and the theatre.

The home provides residential care for up to 14 people. Residents have their own furnished room and can bring small items of furniture, pictures, and ornaments with them when they move in.

All our rooms are comfortable and are well equipped with hand basins. There are toilets and bathrooms located throughout the home.

INSIDE YOUR NEW HOME

Within Bishop Herbert House there are two communal lounges and two good sized dining rooms as well as outside courtyard areas, accessible to all. Wi-fi is also available at the home.

We aim to provide a warm and friendly environment in which to live, and we will be on hand to help and advise on individual needs. The Manager, or a member of the team, will always be available to answer your questions and address any concerns you may have.

OTHER FACILITIES

We will always try to provide or facilitate social activities that promote a high quality of life including arts and crafts, exercise, games, cooking, animal therapy, reminiscence to promote wellbeing and pamper sessions.

CARE PLAN

All residents at Bishop Herbert House are allocated a 'Key Worker' who, under the supervision of a Team Leader is responsible for agreeing a personal care plan.

The care plan, which is regularly reviewed with residents and their loved ones, covers details of how they would like to be cared for and any personal choices and interests.

Family members and friends can of course, be involved in putting together this care plan and we actively encourage them to be included.

The plan will also include an assessment of any risks and how these need to be managed, details of any specific health care needs, medication, doctor, and any other community therapy services provided.
